

## **FACT SHEET**



- 1. Follow DRSABCD
- 2. Advise the patient to immediately stop activity, and sit or lie down.
- 3. If any symptoms are severe or get worse quickly or last for 10 minutes
- Ensure call for an ambulance has been made on Triple Zero (000)
- 4. Loosen tight clothing.
- If patient has been prescribed medication such as a tablet or oral spray for angina, get it and assist the patient in taking it as they have been directed.
- 6. Stay with the patient
- · Monitor response and breathing
- Be prepared to give CPR

## Note

If the person has medication for their condition you can put it in their hand but you as a first aider can't administer it to the patient
